Application INSTRUCTIONS

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

All freshman applicants must submit the following:

1. A completed application form* accompanied by the \$35 application fee
2. An official transcript from your high school listing all of your courses and grades received to date
3. Official SAT or ACT score results
4. Letter of recommendation from your guidance/college counselor or 3 letters of recommendation from clergy, coaches, employers, teachers, etc.
5. Completed Personal Statement

To expedite the process, submit to your counselor the completed application with your check for \$35 so that transcripts and recommendations may be attached and mailed to the Office of Admission. You should provide your counselor with a stamped envelope addressed to:

*As a member of *The Common Application*, Le Moyne College also accepts this form in lieu of its own, giving equal consideration to both. Le Moyne also accepts applications in the following formats: Apply, CCA App (Catholic College Admission Application), EMBARK, and New York Mentor.

INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

Applicants who are not citizens of the United States or do not hold permanent resident visas are considered to be international students. In addition to the general requirements for freshmen, international students must submit the following:

1. Official English translations of all secondary school transcripts
2. Official Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) results or SAT or ACT results
3. Completed Personal Statement for International Applicants
4. Completed Le Moyne College International Student Financial Statement

5. Foreign credit evaluation of college-level course work (www.wes.org)
Applicants whose native language is not English are required to take the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL). Applicants are expected to achieve a score of 550 or higher on the paper version or 213 or higher on the computer version. A score of 600 on the critical reading portion of the SAT or its equivalent exempts applicants from the TOEFL test requirement. All transcripts and letters of recommendation must be certified and submitted in English.

International applicants are eligible for consideration for institutional merit-based scholarships.

HEOP PROGRAM

Students who wish to be considered for HEOP (Higher Education Opportunity Program) must be residents of New York State and be both educationally and economically disadvantaged according to state and institutional guidelines. Please contact your school guidance counselor or the Office of Admission to determine academic and financial eligibility or, if you have further questions, call the HEOP Office at 315-445-4190.

In addition to the general requirements, HEOP candidates must submit a written statement of their family's annual income and complete a diagnostic exam.

STANDARDIZED TEST SCORES

Le Moyne requires official SAT or ACT test results. Scores may be submitted to us as reported on the official high school transcript or directly from the Educational Testing Service (ETS) or the American College Testing Program (ACT). Not all high schools report official scores on the transcript, so please check with your counselor. If you did not already request your scores to be sent to Le Moyne (#2366) from ETS or ACT, you may do so by calling ETS at 609-771-7600 or ACT at 319-337-1313.

International students and students whose native language is not English should submit official results of the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL).

EARLY DECISION PROGRAM

This program is for students who have decided that Le Moyne is their first choice. To be considered for Early Decision, completed applications must be received by December 1. Applicants receive their admission decision by December 15. Candidates who are offered admission must respond with a \$300 non-refundable deposit by January 31 to reserve their place in the class and agree to cancel any outstanding applications to other colleges at this time. Students who have applied for admission through this program and plan to apply for financial aid should submit the Le Moyne College Financial Aid Application by December 1. You will be notified of your financial aid award by January 15. The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) should be submitted by February 1. Applicants who are not offered admission through the Early Decision Program may be reevaluated during the Rolling Admission cycle.

ROLLING ADMISSION

For students wishing to enroll in the fall semester, the Rolling Admission cycle indicates that applications are received throughout the calendar year and that students are notified of their admission decisions beginning in January. Although applications will be received throughout the year, we recommend that students have a complete application on file in the Office of Admission by the priority deadline of February 1. **Students wishing to be considered for academic scholarships are required to have their completed application on file in the Office of Admission by the February I priority deadline.**

APPLICATION FEE

A nonrefundable fee of \$35 must be submitted with your application for admission. Checks should be made payable to Le Moyne College. If submission of this fee causes a financial hardship, please contact the Office of Admission.

Financing YOUR EDUCATION

Le Moyne College considers it essential to provide assistance to students whose personal and family resources are inadequate to meet the full cost of education. The College has developed a program of scholarships, grants, loans, and employment which are awarded to full-time students based on demonstrated financial need.

Academic and athletic scholarship funds are not based on need, and are awarded to recognize academic success and/or athletic talent.

The following information provides a brief overview of aid available at Le Moyne. More detailed information is available at the Office of Financial Aid.

**Although students will not be billed by the College for these expenses, these figures provide a general guideline in determining expenses and are used to compute need for financial aid packages.*

APPLICATION PROCEDURES

In order to apply for all the aid available through Le Moyne, an incoming student must file the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and the Le Moyne College Freshman Financial Aid Application. The FAFSA is available online at www.fafsa.ed.gov, in any high school guidance counselor's office and at the College's Office of Financial Aid. The FAFSA should be completed by February 1. The deadline for receipt of the forms at the College is March 15. The Le Moyne College Financial Aid Application will be provided to all applicants.

Once a student has been accepted by the College, his or her financial aid application is reviewed, and a decision on aid is sent to the student. If an offer of financial assistance is made and the student plans to enroll at Le Moyne, then signed copies of the student's federal tax return and the parents' tax return should be sent to the Office of Financial Aid at Le Moyne College by May 1.

Any type of financial aid administered by the College may be revoked in the event that a discrepancy between the applicant's statement of need and his or her current financial status is discovered.
